Pastor's Corner of Light: Through Many Tribulations

Plain Bible Teachings Sermon: Andy Sochor Feb 20, 2017

Text: Acts 14:22 Paul and Barnabas encouraged the brethren to remain faithful to the Lord "through many tribulations" so they could reach the final reward of heaven. The kinds of tribulations that we may face could be unique to Christians or common to all people. Any of these tribulations could potentially derail our faith and cause us to come up short of the reward. So, we need to prepare ourselves to make it through these tribulations to reach the eternal kingdom. A man uniquely able to teach us about this is Job.

Job was a blameless man (Job 1:1,8) and had been blessed by God (Job 1:2,3). Then due to the scheming of Satan he loses his children, his possessions, & his health (Job 113-19; 2:7) Job lost much in this situation but I am sure the most devastating loss was that of his children. Sometimes such a loss may strike at the core of our faith and cause us to question the goodness of God (Job 2:9) As in this case, the prince of this world (Lk 4; John 12:31; 14:30; 16:11; Eph 2:2; 2 Cor 4:4) has much influence in what happens. Rom 5:12 explains that sin I and death came into the world together and thus **Heb 9:27** tells us that it is appointed for all to die since all have sinned (**Rom 3:23**). Our experience with death with various loved ones is a direct consequence of these different factors. We should ultimately remember that Jesus removed Satan's power of death (Heb 2:14) and the reality of heaven awaits us (1 Thess 4:13ff; Rev 14:13).

In a similar fashion, worrying about material things of this world can also choke out the spirit of Christ (Luke 8:14 seeds among the thorns). Our hope and trust in this world's possessions can lead us to steal (Prov 30:7-9), envy (Gal 5:21), or just be ungrateful (Rev 2:9; 1 Thess 5:18). In order to remain faithful, we must fix our hope on God (1 Tim 6:17), lay-up treasures in heaven (Mtt 6:20; 1 Tim 6:19) and learn contentment (Philistines 4:11-13).

An additional loss that Job and many in this world experience is that of health. This is also very personal. Paul tells us in 2 Cor 12:7ff that he too was experiencing a "thorn in the flesh" and God saw fit to use it in his life. James 5:14 states that suffering is a time for us to join in prayer for each other. **2 Cor 4:16 – 5:4** explains that our earthly vessel is but a temporary situation and James 1:12 encourages us to maintain our life in Christ through whatever trials it is that • we encounter so that we will receive the crown of life which the Lord has promised to those that love Him. **1 Peter 1:4** "to obtain an inheritance which is imperishable and undefiled and will not fade away, reserved in heaven for you who are protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time." Rom 8:28 seeks to encourage us to remain faithful and trust in God to bring some good out of our struggles. Rom 5:3-5 tells us that there is in fact some good that can come from suffering: "And not only that, but we also glory in tribulations, knowing that tribulation produces perseverance; and perseverance, character; and character, hope. Now hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out in our hearts by the Holy Spirit who was given to us." Remain faithful and let God work in your life.
