Pastor's Corner of Light: Fighting the Good Fight: 1 Tim 6:12

Last week I shared the story of someone who went through a very difficult time and suggested that such situations can actually be a good thing for us with regard to our faith and trust in the Lord. **James 1:12** encourages us: "Blessed is the man who perseveres under trial: for once he has been approved, he will receive the crow of life which the Lord has promised to those who love Him." Being faithful requires that we have a close connection to the Lord through the Spirit. Consider also: **Eph 6:11** "Put on the full armor of God, so that you will be able to stand firm against the schemes of the devil." With such an assurance that God will be with us, do you ever wonder why fear and anxiety invade our minds? Do you ever look back on past struggles and see how God has worked in your life. Jesus tells us in **Mtt 6:33** that we should seek His kingdom and righteousness and the things of this world will be provided for us.

An additional blessing is our church family. **From them** we receive encourage-ment, strength and guidance (**Heb 10:24**). **From the Word** we receive teaching, correction and training in righteousness (2 Tim 3:16). In our baptism we are united with Christ and receive the gift of the Holy Spirit to help guide us and connect us to the Father. **Rom 8:26** "In the same way the Spirit also helps our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we should, but the Spirit Himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words". **Philistines 4:6,7** "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your request be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

There is a war going on around us. It is not something we can ignore or escape. **Jude** reminds us that we must contend for the faith (v. 3). He reminds us of the judgment passed down to those disobedient to the Lord so let us not find ourselves deviating from the teachings of Scripture. We need to prepare ourselves for those spiritual battles that we encounter. If you return to the passage **Eph 6:10-17** you will see what Paul says about our spiritual battles: **We must put our trust in God**; **We must know our enemy; We must arm ourselves.** We cannot escape this spiritual war that is being waged all around us. Yet God has provided everything we need to be equipped for this fight. **Philippians 4:19** "And my God will supply every need of yours according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus." Through Him, we can be fully assured of victory in the end and receiving our crown of life (James 1:12)

When nothing else or no one else in your live remains and is faithful, you can rest assured that God will be both.

I love the honesty of the Bible. I love that faith in God doesn't require you and me to play monkey games with reality. I love that the Bible's description of life in this fallen world is accurate and familiar. Psalm 90 is one of the most honest and descriptive psalms. How's this for honesty? "The years of our life are seventy, or even by reason of strength eighty; yet their span is but toil and trouble; they are soon gone, and we fly away" (v.10). Here's what the psalmist is saying: "Your life will be short and will be marked by difficulty." Not very good news is it? But it's true. You live in a fallen world that itself groans, waiting for redemption. You live with flawed people who think, say, and do wrong things. You live in a place where corruption, immorality, injustice, pollution, and disease still live and do their ugly work. You live in an environment that does not function according to God's original design. Every day is marked by little troubles, and big trouble will enter your door as well.

In all this, you are tempted to feel alone, forsaken, poor, and unable. In all this, you are tempted to wonder whether God exists, let alone if he hears or cares. In your trouble, some people around you are insensitive and unloving. They find your troubles to be too much of a burden. And the people who are sensitive and loving have little power to erase your trouble. This is why the beginning of this psalm of trouble is so important. This honest psalm doesn't begin with trouble; it begins with the most important declaration that anyone who faces trouble could ever hear: "Lord, you have been our dwelling place in all generations. Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God" (vv. 1-2).

If you are God's child, you are not alone. Glorious grace has connected you to the One whose power and love don't shift with the times. Grace has connected you and me to the One who is the ultimate dwelling place, the ultimate place to which we can run. This means that I am never left just to my own resources. I am never left to figure out and deal with life on my own. As God's child, I must never see myself as poor or forsaken. I must never buy into the lie that I have no recourse or hope. I must never think that my life is ruled by my difficulty. I must never give way to despondency or despair. Grace has opened the door of hope and refuge to me by connecting me to One who is eternal and who rules all the circumstances and relationships that would cause me to feel alone.
