PASTOR'S CORNER - The Road to Joy

The road to joy, for Jesus, ran through Jerusalem. It was a path of self-denial, sacrifice and death – before it was a passage into joy, redemption, and glory. So it is for all who would follow in His footsteps. To walk with Jesus is to take the way of the cross. True joy moves through hardship. True joy goes with Jesus through Jerusalem. The way is narrow, and the gate is small, but freedom and joy await the disciple who stays on the path. Jesus said, 'Whoever wants to be My disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow Me. (Mtt 16:23) This is one of His most intimidating challenges. It is also one of the most misunderstood. "Get off the road that leads to death," He is saying. "Choose instead this unexpected way to the good life – through denying and dying to self."

Christian spiritual formation rests on this indispensable foundation of death to self and the formation of a new self – a new heart devoted O God, a life of honesty, vulnerability, acceptance, friendship, communion and purpose. Self-denial leads to a joyful submission to the Father. It is the freedom to reject the ways of the world – its anger, greed, and envy. It is an active choice to become like Jesus in His radical inner simplicity and wholehearted devotion to the Father. Self-denial frees us to love and serve others; we can and will be merciful toward others because God is merciful toward us.

Self-denial, then, is both the most difficult thing in our Christian life and the simplest. Laying down our lives cannot happen just once; it's a complete surrender we make moment by moment, every day. Only if we truly embrace Jesus' self-denying, non-defensive death on the cross can we believe we are accepted into His Father's delight. As we abide in Him, walking by His spirit, we come out with complete joy. In this world consumed with acquiring and consuming self-denial seems like a radical and dangerous thing. But in the right-side-up of Jesus' kingdom, it is the safest, happiest place. John 15:10,11 "If simplest, and VOU keep Μv commandments, you will abide in My love; just as I have kept My Fathers commandments and abide in His love. These things I have spoken to you so that My joy may be in you, and that your joy may be made complete." In this way we will find/achieve that abundant life He has promises us (John 10:10).

THE ARMOR OF GOD
