A previous article shared the story of a good sister in Christ working in a local Leper Colony providing food for the students in their after-school program. This sister is a widow & has two children who are now in college, and she provides for her mother. She never asks for anything more than what she is provided each month. When asked if there is something else that might be needed, she replied, "I am very grateful for the help you are already providing." When she was pressed she confessed that her small stove was not working very well. A new propane stove with two burners has been provided and is also being used to provide the evening meal for the school children.

The children range from 6 to 13 years old and attend this special government school (they are not allowed to attend a public school). Besides being fed these children also receive help with their homework & are taught basic Bible stories and lessons. Unfortunately, teaching the Bible and about Christ has become a problem. Hindus in the area are trying to get the landlord to stop renting to her because they do not want someone teaching children about Christ. So far, the owner has not forced her out, but every month he asks if she has found another place.

While enough food is prepared for 50 children each day, the average attendance is approximately 35. The extra food is packaged to be taken home for their household family. Sometimes an adult from the leper colony will ask for something to eat, and if there is food left over, they will not be turned away.

This is a special program and most of these children would not receive a good meal on a regular basis. Please remember them in your prayers. If you would like to contribute to this program makes checks payable to:
