# PASTOR'S CORNER - Anxiety: continued part 2 of 2

Fear is focused on the here and now and anxiety is focused on a possible threat in the future. Anxiety is an orientation toward the future with two basic assumptions that work to make us miserable: my future is vulnerable, and my future is up to me. The first assumption is true. Even Scripture tells us that our lives are but for a short span of time. As humans, we're stuck with the ability to know this about ourselves and to feel it in advance.

The second assumption occurs because we tend to feel responsible for those uncertain futures and never more so than today. By instinct, we try to bring as much of this world under our control as we can so that we can optimize our experience wherever possible. When we push back on anxiety by looking at all we bring to the table, we are feeding the very problem we hope to solve. AND "the future is up to you" is just another way of saying, "You're on your own." In a way, anxiety is a form of loneliness. If this world is everything, and if it's on us to make the most of it, anxiety really does make sense. But fortunately, there is more than this world/life – there IS something after this world/life. In John 14 Jesus shares how He is leaving to prepare a 'place' for us when we leave this world. 1 Peter 1:3-5 expands this message: basically it says that there are two pillars to our hope (future is imperishable & reserved for you) that are perfectly matched to the two major factors in our anxiety (my future is vulnerable, and my future is up to me). On earth we are vulnerable, but our inheritance/future in heaven is not. We often feel responsible, but our lives are guarded by God. Peter says our inheritance is kept in heaven, so our future is not vulnerable and our future is not up to us – God has taken care of it!!!

Our new inheritance is *imperishable* and undefiled and unfading. In this world every good thing comes tainted and ends. That is why in heaven all joy is pure. There, no joy ever fades. That's what God is keeping for us in heaven. **Rev 21:4** reveals to us a world where "death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away." A new world is coming where nothing is vulnerable. In our future we're born again to a living hope and **verse 5** tells us that we are not responsible for that future – God has it under control.

For now, we're still vulnerable and may struggle with anxiety but we do *NOT* have to live like pagans. God has given us exactly the medicine we need in the hope of heaven—a future that is not vulnerable, guaranteed by a God who is responsible. The key is to figure out where to apply that medicine. We feel anxious when we're expecting something negative for our future. The hope of heaven should change our perspective on our future. We have an inheritance to set our hearts on that nothing can possibly touch and a Father who will guard us for that day no matter what may come our way in the meantime. These are the pillars of our hope for the future. When we feel anxious, we should ask which pillar is wavering and shore it up with the truth of the gospel.
